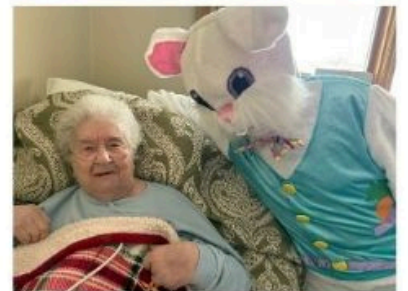

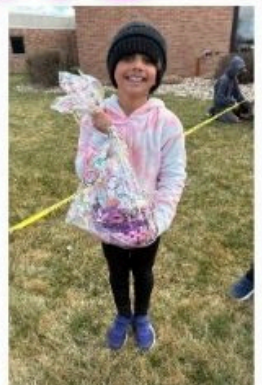
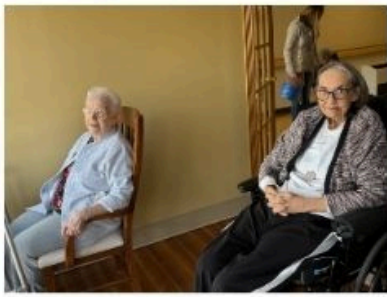

Morsels N' More: Hibiscus Punch

Ingredients

- 1 cup dried hibiscus petals
- 3½ cups water
- 3 cups fresh pineapple juice
- ½ cup grenadine
- 2 tablespoons fresh lime juice



Instructions

In a small pot, bring water to a boil, then add the dried hibiscus petals. Steep for 15 minutes and let cool completely. In a large pitcher, mix hibiscus water, pineapple juice, grenadine, and lime juice. Serve over ice and enjoy!
